Olympic Champion Duff Gibson and Calgary Sport Council to Launch FREE Sport Discovery Initiative for City's Youth

– All Sport One Day Community-Wide Initiative Expands to Six Partner Facilities –

Calgary, Alberta – On Saturday, June 19, All Sport One Day will provide over 1,200 young Calgarians, ages 6-12, with an opportunity to discover a new sport for FREE by registering online at AllSportOneDay.ca.

For Olympic Champion Duff Gibson, the Calgary Sport Council's Ambassador, the importance of All Sport One Day is in the moments of sport discovery.

"I wish every kid had the chance to find a sport they love to do. That's why I'm proud again to team up with the Calgary Sport Council for All Sport One Day," said Gibson. "This is an incredible time for sport in Canada and getting kids into something new is what this initiative is all about."

Now in its second year, the community initiative that began with two partner facilities and four sport organizations has expanded to include six facilities and 23 organizations. That's good news for Calgary Sport Council's Chair, Mike Urquhart who is pleased with the growth of All Sport One Day.

"We welcome Calgary's youth to a sampling of unique sport activities offered throughout the City," said Urquhart.

"The support we are receiving from our partner facilities and sport organizations is fantastic, allowing our capacity to more than triple in size for 2010. With the opportunity to discover 30 sport activities, we hope that a great day of fun will help encourage Calgary's youth to make sport an important part of their lives."

Joining Cardel Place and WinSport Canada's Canada Olympic Park are four new partner facilities including Don Hartman North East Sportsplex, South Fish Creek Recreation Association and The City of Calgary's Southland Leisure Centre and Village Square Leisure Centre.

To expand the scope of the event and its community reach, the following sport activities are being offered: Aikido, Archery, Badminton, Balance Challenge, Biathlon, Climbing, Cricket, Fencing, Floor Hockey, Gymnastics, Hip Hop, Hockey, Judo, Karate, Lacrosse, Learn to Skate, Roller Luge, Mountain Biking, Netball, Orienteering, Ringette, Roller Hockey, Ski Jumping, Team Handball, Touch Rugby, Trampoline, Ultimate Frisbee, Vertical Challenge, Wallyball and Wushu.

Several of Canada's most prominent Olympic and Paralympic medallists and Olympic hopefuls also committed volunteer time to promote All Sport One Day acting as the Calgary Sport Council's Ambassadors including Duff Gibson, Amy Nixon, Blythe Hartley,

Carol Huynh, Colleen Sostorics, Denny Morrison, Earle Connor, Jessica Zelinka, Kristina Groves, Kyle Shewfelt and Ryan Correy.

All Sport One Day Ambassadors have visited elementary schools to inspire Calgary kids to get involved and discover a new sport. The Ambassadors will also welcome kids and get into the action during All Sport One Day.

Cardel Place General Manager, Sue Scott, is thrilled about the development of All Sport One Day and the expansion to six facilities.

“As a partner facility, All Sport One Day is extremely important to helping us reach one of our primary goals at Cardel Place – to enhance quality of life through sport discovery and physical activity. And we know we can’t achieve this outcome alone,” said Scott.

“Through the partnership with five other facilities we look forward to collectively creating opportunities for all children and youth to play. Our hope is that the Calgary Sport Council’s All Sport One Day is the catalyst that sparks lifelong interest in sport and a passion for physical activity.”
